- The Board itself is diverse in some ways, but we are very aware that in others it is not. Therefore we are committed to establishing a co-mentoring programme where we will ask colleagues from diverse backgrounds to help guide and develop Board members in the understanding of the challenges faced.
- We will encourage our members to learn and engage more through literature to support greater understanding, awareness and active change of racist and/or discriminatory practice and to create a culture of challenging those behaviours.
